

SAFE WORKING PRACTICES

1.0. REMOVAL OF SPILLAGES & OTHER BODILY FLUIDS

Only trained and authorised Cleaning Operatives should attend and act on sensitive waste call outs – Training will be provided by SOLO SERVICE GROUP on the use of Body Spillage and Sharps kits & the safe removal of Body Spillages, Clinical Spillages and Sharps.

Cleaning operatives who have not received training must not handle sensitive waste.

SENSITIVE WASTE is defined as the following:-

Body Fluid Spillages – Vomit, Urine, Blood, Saliva, Semen, Animal/Human Waste

Clinical Waste – Animal/Human Tissue, Plasters, Swabs, Dressings, Drugs and other pharmaceutical products, medical waste.

Sharps – Hypodermic Syringes, Broken Glass, Scalpels, Razors, Blades

The following procedure is to be adopted for Body fluid disposal:-

1. Erect Warning signs
2. Put on apron, sleeves, gloves, goggles & safety glasses
3. Sprinkle the Sanitising powder over spillage and leave to gel.
4. Use scoop to remove the crystallised waste.
5. Place the waste within a yellow bio hazard bag.
6. Spray on the disinfectant and leave for one minute.
7. Wipe off with absorbent cloth/tissue
8. Clean surface as normal
9. Pull gloves inside out and put inside bag
10. Pull off sleeves inside out and put inside bag
11. Clean goggles/glasses
12. Use hand wipe sachet, put into yellow clinical waste bag
13. Seal and date bag, take to lockable storage area.
14. All sensitive waste must be kept in a secure area until collection.
15. Inform Customer to arrange disposal and arrange for a new body spillage kit.
